CRIMES REPORTED

Below is some of the crimes that have been reported for November 2024.

LORNE GARDENS 01/11/2024 ATTEMPTED BURGLARY

Suspects were seen driving up and down the road in a black Audi, two males then exited the vehicle and tried the victims front door handle after having looked around in the rear of the property, suspects did not gain entry and left the scene.

LORNE GARDENS 25/11/2024 THEFT OF MOTOR VEHICLE

Victim had parked their vehicle on their driveway and two suspects were seen a little while later walking up and down the road, at which they stopped and walked back towards victims vehicle, vehicle was stolen a short while later.

ADVICE

It is the time of year where we see a sharp increase in theft, burglary and robbery offences, We advice that residents keep vehicles locked when not in use even if you are only away from your vehicle for a short time, it is also advised to use extra measures such as a steering wheel lock.

In regards to homes we advise that residents double lock doors where possible and consider installing ring door bells and security lighting that covers both the front and rear of the property.

Furthermore if residents visit shopping areas it is advised to keep phones out of sight wherever possible.
